


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WELCOME FROM JOEL STERN

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


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




















































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

ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

The NAMWOLF Pipeline Diversity Scholarship seeks to provide financial support to students who contribute to the diversity of the law school student body as they pursue their legal career. The NAMWOLF Pipeline Diversity Scholarship program is open to 2020–21 second- and third-year African American, Hispanic, Asian, Native American, LGBTQ+ and female students. Any other 2020–21 second- and third-year law students who come from backgrounds that would add to the cause of diversity, regardless of race or gender, are eligible to apply.

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One of the many unfortunate realities of our criminal justice system is that Black Americans are more likely to be arrested; once arrested, they are more likely to be convicted; and once convicted, they are more likely to experience lengthy prison sentences. Beyond that, the impact of a criminal record on one's future is often pervasive and long-lasting. With that in mind, we are donating our time and money to Project Clean Slate, an initiative of Detroit at Work and the Detroit Law Department to help residents get their criminal records expunged to gain access to better jobs, housing, and educational opportunities. Project Clean Slate is free to all eligible Detroit residents.

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
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
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Michelle Silverthorn Founder & CEO INCLUSION NATION

Michelle Silverthorn believes that diversity and inclusion needs a new voice for a new generation. A recognized expert in organizational inclusion, Michelle has worked with Fortune 500 companies, tech start-ups, nonprofit organizations, universities, and numerous companies across every industry. From thousand-person

conferences to twenty-person workshops, Michelle equips all of her audiences with the knowledge and skills to finally move forward on diversity and inclusion.

A graduate of Princeton University and the University of Michigan Law School, Michelle practiced for two large law firms in New York and Chicago. She then transitioned into the education field where she trained thousands in-person and online, about unconscious bias, diversity and inclusion, and millennials in the workplace. She has written several articles on those topics, including a well-received op-ed for the Chicago Tribune on unconscious bias. She is a TEDx speaker and the author of the book, "Authentic Diversity, How Great Leaders Can Change the Workplace For Good."

Michelle previously worked as an arts and entertainment journalist in Trinidad and Tobago, a researcher in Puno, Peru and Geneva, Switzerland, and a volunteer teacher in Gaborone, Botswana and Almaty, Kazakhstan. Michelle grew up in the Caribbean and now lives in Chicago with her husband Daniel and their two daughters.

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SENATOR | ILLINOIS Tammy Duckworth

U.S. Senator Tammy Duckworth is an Iraq War Veteran, Purple Heart recipient and former Assistant Secretary of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs who was among the first handful of Army women to fly combat missions during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Duckworth served in the Reserve Forces for 23 years before retiring at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in 2014. She was elected to the U.S. Senate in 2016 after representing Illinois's Eighth Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives for two terms.

In 2004, Duckworth was deployed to Iraq as a Blackhawk helicopter pilot for the Illinois Army National Guard. On November 12, 2004, her helicopter was hit by an RPG and she lost her legs and partial use of her right arm. Senator Duckworth

spent the next year recovering at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, where she quickly became an advocate for her fellow Soldiers. After she recovered, she became Director of the Illinois Department of Veterans' Affairs, where she helped create a tax credit for employers that hire Veterans, established a first-in-the-nation 24/7 Veterans crisis hotline and developed innovative programs to improve Veterans' access to housing and health care.

In 2009, President Obama appointed Duckworth as an Assistant Secretary of Veterans Affairs, where she coordinated a joint initiative with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to help end Veteran homelessness, worked to address the unique challenges faced by female as well as Native American Veterans and created the Office of Online Communications to improve the VA's accessibility, especially among young Veterans.

In the U.S. House, Duckworth served on the Armed Services Committee and was an advocate for working families and job creation, introducing bills like her bipartisan Friendly Airports for Mothers (FAM) Act to ensure new mothers have access to safe, clean and accessible lactation rooms when traveling through airports, which is now law. She helped lead passage of the bipartisan Clay Hunt SAV Act, which enhanced efforts to track and reduce Veteran suicides. She also passed the Troop Talent Act to help returning Veterans find jobs in the private sector and worked to cut waste and fraud at the Pentagon and throughout government, including passing a common-sense provision that was projected to save taxpayers \$4 billion by reducing redundancy in military uniforms. In the U.S. Senate, Duckworth advocates for practical, common-sense solutions needed to move our state and country forward like rebuilding our crumbling infrastructure, protecting Illinoisans from lead poisoning, growing manufacturing jobs while supporting minority-owned small businesses, investing in communities that have been ignored for too long and making college more affordable for all Americans. She co-founded the Senate's first-ever Environmental Justice Caucus and also continues her lifelong mission of supporting, protecting and keeping the promises we've made to our Veterans as well as ensuring that we stand fully behind the troops our nation sends into danger overseas. In 2018, after Duckworth became the first Senator to give birth while serving in office, she sent a message to working families across the country about the value of family-friendly policies by securing a historic rules change that allows Senators to bring their infant children onto the Senate floor.

Senator Duckworth serves on several influential committees that give her an important platform to advocate for Illinois's working families and entrepreneurs: the Armed Services Committee; the Environment & Public Works Committee; the Commerce, Science, & Transportation Committee; and the Small Business & Entrepreneurship Committee. The first Senate bill she introduced—which supports Illinois jobs by helping prevent bureaucratic delays in infrastructure projects—became law in record time. As a result of her achievements, Duckworth was ranked as a "highly effective lawmaker" and as the most effective freshman Democratic Senator in the 115th Congress by the Center for Effective Lawmaking, Duckworth is fluent in Thai and Indonesian. She attended college at the University of Hawaii and earned a Master of Arts in International Affairs from the George Washington University.



Senator Duckworth and her husband Bryan are the proud parents of two daughters, Abigail and Maile.



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

Ricardo A. Anzaldua

Executive Vice President, General Counsel and Corporate Secretary | FREDDIE MAC Ricardo A. Anzaldua is executive vice president, general counsel and corporate secretary of Freddie Mac. In his role as principal legal counsel, Anzaldua oversees all legal and regulatory strategies, services and resources, and manages all corporate governance matters. Before joining Freddie Mac, Anzaldua was executive vice president and general counsel of MetLife, Inc., where, from 2012 to 2017, he was responsible for the company's global legal operations, global compliance and government relations. Anzaldua began his legal career at the law firm of Cleary, Gottlieb, Steen & Hamilton LLP, where he

was named partner in 1999. He earned his law degree from Harvard Law School and holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Brown University, where he studied development economics and Latin American history. Anzaldua is chairman of the board of trustees for the International Institute of Rural Reconstruction, and he serves on the boards of the Minority Corporate Counsel Association and the New York City Bar. He is a member of the Hispanic National Bar Association and American Bar Association.



Anthony E. (Tony) Gay Vice President and General Counsel | PECO

Tony Gay serves as the chief legal officer of the company and oversees its team of attorneys responsible for all aspects of PECO's legal affairs in Pennsylvania, as well as PECO's claims department. Based in Philadelphia, PECO is Pennsylvania's largest electric and natural gas utility. The company employs about 2,700 people, owns \$10 billion in assets, and generates approximately \$2.8 billion in annual revenues. A subsidiary of Exelon Corporation, the nation's largest competitive energy provider, PECO serves 1.6 million electric and more than 525,000 natural gas customers

in southeastern Pennsylvania. Exelon is headquartered in Chicago and is listed on NASDAQ under the ticker symbol "EXC." Tony previously served as vice president of Governmental & External Affairs, where he was responsible for state and local government affairs, along with external stakeholder outreach, marketing, large customer services, and for the company's economic development initiatives. Before that, he provided legal support to PECO's regulatory department. Prior to joining PECO, Tony supported Verizon Communication's legal team, served at the law firm of Morgan, Lewis & Bockius LLP, and clerked for U.S. District Judge Raymond A. Jackson. Before entering the legal profession, he worked for the Department of Veterans Affairs in its Adjudication Division, at Valley Forge National Park as a park ranger, and as a writer at KYW NewsRadio.

Kodwo Ghartey-Tagoe serves as executive vice president, chief legal officer and corporate secretary for Duke Energy. He is the primary legal advisor to Duke Energy's board of directors and senior management, and he leads the Office of the General Counsel, which includes the company's legal, corporate governance, internal audit, and ethics and compliance functions. Joining the company in 2002, Ghartey-Tagoe has held numerous positions in the legal department covering several areas of legal services to Duke Energy. Prior to being named chief legal officer in October 2019 and corporate secretary in May 2020, Ghartey-

Tagoe served as president of Duke Energy's utility operations in South Carolina. Before joining the company, Ghartey-Tagoe was a partner with McGuireWoods LLP in Richmond, VA. Ghartey-Tagoe serves on the board of visitors of Duke University Law School. He is also on the advisory board of Progress in Education Inc., a charitable and educational organization that serves students in Ghana and the USA. In 2013, Ghartey-Tagoe received the Diversity Champion Award from the Charlotte Business Journal, and the Thurgood Marshall College Fund honored him with an Award of Excellence for his outstanding achievements in the legal profession and his dedication to diversity in the workplace. A native of Ghana, Ghartey-Tagoe earned a Juris Doctor degree from Duke University and a Bachelor of Arts degree, with joint honors in economics and finance, from McGill University in Montreal, Quebec. He also completed the Advanced Management Program at the Wharton School of Business. In 2017, he was conferred an honorary Doctor of Humanities degree by Francis Marion University. Ghartey-Tagoe and his wife, Phyllis, have three daughters - Effe, Aseda and Gracie.

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
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

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
